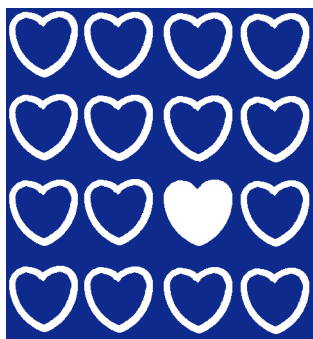

KEYNOTE

“Preparing for the Unexpected and Unthinkable”

James “Jimmy” Albrecht will conduct a presentation about his personal experiences during the response by NYC rescue personnel to the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001. He will follow with an analysis of these endeavors, outline challenges encountered and the many exceptional accomplishments, and highlight the impact that this event has had on law enforcement and rescue agencies in NYC and nationally.

JAMES “JIMMY” ALBRECHT - Jim is a 20-year veteran of the NYPD who retired as the Commanding Officer of NYPD Transit Bureau District 20, responsible for the supervision and deployment of over 300 police officers tasked with the prevention of crime in the subway and rapid transit system in the borough of Queens, New York City. Captain Albrecht was a first responder and incident command staff manager at the September 11, 2001 terrorist attack on the World Trade Center and the November 12, 2001 commercial airliner accident in Queens, NYC. James Albrecht is the editor and co-author of the book *Effective Crime Reduction Strategies: International Perspectives* and has many published works dealing with law enforcement, community policing, legal history, crime reduction strategies, and terrorism.

PRISON GANG VIOLENCE

- A presentation on the administration and procedures of the gang office within TDCJ. This presentation will also include an overview of Prison Gangs, Cliques and Tango's within TDCJ along with basic tattoo identification.

Reuben Gonzales - Reuben Gonzales has worked for the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Institutions Division for 15 years. He started working gangs for the department March of 2002. He promoted to Security Threat Group Sergeant on the Formby Unit in Plainview where he worked gangs for almost five years. On Sept 1st, 2008 he promoted from the Formby Unit to become the Region 5 Gang Coordinator for TDCJ where he presently works overseeing and training the gang officers on fourteen complexes. He has set up and conducted training for various organizations and departments on gang identification and trends within TDCJ, to include Texas Violent Gang Task Force and Texas Gang Investigators Association. DON'T GET USED UP: PROFESSIONAL SELF CARE

- Professionals in corrections and counseling receive years and years of training to help and rehabilitate others, yet they often have trouble taking care of themselves. This workshop teaches you why self-care is not selfish.

Richard Kownacki, Ph.D. - worked with the courts for seven years as a probation officer, substance abuse counselor, program evaluator, and staff trainer before earning his doctorate in clinical psychology. His master's thesis—Wounded Healers—showed that helping professionals come from more dysfunctional families, but by overcoming their own issues they emerge healthier than nonhelping professionals. For the past 10 years he has been in private practice in Wichita Falls. His book, *Do Not Go Gentle*.

VICTIM'S RIGHTS

- Topics of interest: How crime affects the victim and the community as a whole; Working with offenders and their beliefs; Victim's Rights vs. Offender's Rights; Victim/Offender Mediation (VOM); and Victim Impact Panel (VIP).

Becky Bell - Victim Coordinator for Wichita County Juvenile Probation Department, graduated from Midwestern State University in 1999, with a Bachelor of Social Work. She is currently enrolled in the General Counseling Graduate Program at Midwestern State University. She has worked with at-risk youth and their families for the past 11 years. The last 8 years have been spent with the Wichita County Juvenile Probation Department as a Certified Juvenile Probation Officer in various capacities. Becky completed the 40-hour basic mediation course from the Dispute Resolution Center of Austin Texas. Becky Bell is the founder and Vice President of the Board for PAWS for Greatness.

David Sabine, Ph.D. - a Clinical Psychologist in Private Practice for the past 15 years in Wichita Falls, TX. Dr. Sabine applies his years of practical psychology with a heart full of soft spoken Texan warmth and good humor providing articulate wisdom with cogent answers to complex issues. He works daily with families and children and speaks widely on issues related to the family. His doctorate is from the University of Louisville, and he was a Pre-doctoral Fellow at Yale University. Dr Sabine is the author of the book *Chair With A View*.

SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASE AND HIV/AIDS/STD/HEP/TB

- Participants will be presented with information on the epidemiology of sexually transmitted disease, differentiate between viral, bacterial and protozoan sexually transmitted infections and prevention. Participants will also learn about the symptoms and modes of transmissions of Hepatitis A,B,C, HIV/AIDS, TB and some of the more prominent sexually transmitted diseases. This session will be specific to counties served by the Wichita County Health Department.

Keith Williamson, M.D. - Board Certified American Academy of Family Medicine, Midwestern State University Physician.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

- An exploration of the burgeoning global phenomenon of human trafficking and the international sex trade. Emphasis will be on the incidence and prevalence of human smuggling from both the global and local perspectives. Case studies will be presented and special consideration given to appropriate investigative and prosecutorial responses.

Nathan R. Moran, Ph.D. - Dr. Moran completed his Ph.D. at Sam Houston State University's College of Criminal Justice, and wrote his doctoral dissertation on the globalization and evolution of organized crime. Dr. Moran is currently Associate Professor (Tenured) and Chair of the Criminal Justice Department at Midwestern State University, and Director of the Institute for Law Enforcement Excellence (ILEE). Dr. Moran teaches courses on organized crime and terrorism, international crime, comparative criminal justice systems, policing, research design, and statistics. Dr. Moran has written several books, and is currently under contract to write a textbook (with co-author Dr. Robert Hanser) entitled *Comparative Criminal Justice Systems: A Regional Approach* (Sage Publications), which is scheduled for publication in 2013.

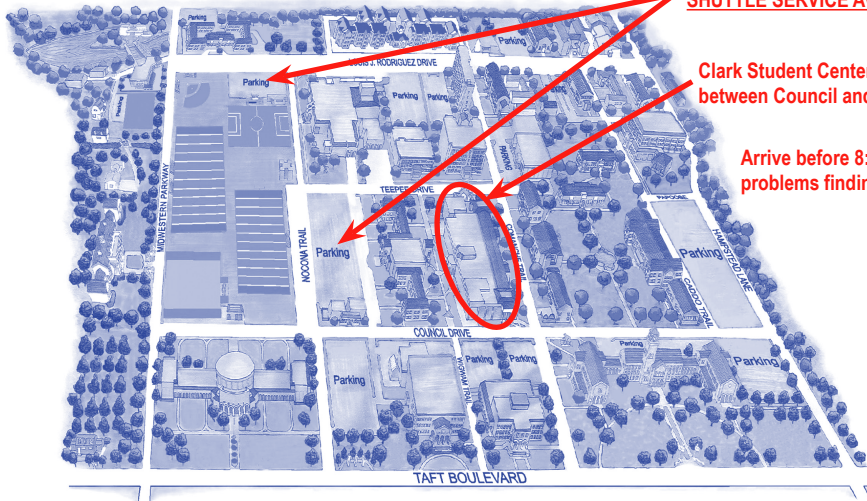

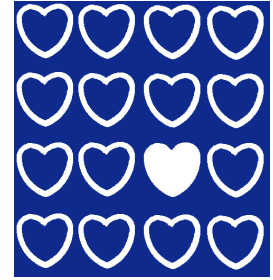
